4	County, California, Merced Property & Casualty Company (Merced) would be rendered

6	Liquidator and Restraining Orders (Liquidation Order) of the Merced estate. The Liquidation
7	Order appoints David E. Wilson, Special Deputy Insurance Commissioner and Chief Executive

9	Mr. Wilson retired, and the Commissioner appointed Joseph Holloway as Special Deputy

11	Mr. Wilson's retirement, Mr. Holloway has been acting in the place and stead of Mr. Wilson as
12	Deputy Liquidator of the Merced estate. The Commissioner seeks an order to amend the
13	Liquidation Order to reflect Mr. Holloway's appointment as the Commissioner's Deputy
14	Liquidator. The motion should be granted.

5	Exs. A, B [California Senate confirmed Mr. Holloway's appointment as the Chief Executive		
6	Officer on Mar. 1, 2021], & C [appointment as Special Deputy Commissioner].) Since his		
7	appointment as Chief Executive Officer, Mr. Holloway has been acting in the place and stead of		
8	the Mr. Wilson as the Deputy Liquidator of the Merced estate. (Id. \P 6.)		
9	As explained in the Commissioner's application for an order approving the Commissioner's		
10	sale of Merced's real property assets to Homen Properties, LLC (Homen) filed concurrently with		
11	this motion to amend the Liquidation Order, the Commissioner is proposing to sell the Merced		
12	real property assets to Homen for \$1,665,000 cash. Under the terms of the Liquidation Order, title		
13	to the real property is vested in the Commissioner, as Liquidator of the Merced estate. (Liq.		
14	Order, p. 2.) Acting as the Deputy Liquidator of the Merced estate, Joseph Holloway approved		
15	and signed the February 22, 2022 real estate commercial purchase agreement and seller counter-		
16	offer upon which the pending sale will be made. (Holloway Decl., \P 6.)		
17	II. THE COURT SHOULD AMEND THE LIQUIDATION ORDER TO APPOINT JOSEPH HOLLOWAY AS DEPUTY LIQUIDATOR		
18	HOLLOWAY AS DEPUTY LIQUIDATOR		
19	Insurance Code section 1016 authorizes the Commissioner to apply to the Court for an		
20	order to liquidate and wind up the business of an insolvent insurer. The powers vested in the		
21	Commissioner for purposes of enabling him to perform his duties as a liquidator of an insolvent		
22	insurance company are wide. These include, among others, the authority to acquire and dispose of		
23	property belonging to the insolvent insurer and to appoint and employ deputy commissioners to		
24	carry out his functions. (Ins. Code, §§ 1035, 1037.) To assist the Commissioner, Insurance Code		
25	section 1020 provides that this court shall issue orders as may be deemed necessary to prevent		
26	waste of assets and interference with the Commissioner or the liquidation proceeding.		
27	In the present case, the Commissioner established that it would be futile to proceed with the		
28	conduct of the business of Merced and, at his request, the court issued an order to liquidate the		

1	estate. The court authorized the Commissioner to appoint and employ special deputies, and to	
2	appoint David E. Wilson as Deputy Liquidator. Mr. Wilson retired, and the Commissioner	
3	appointed Mr. Holloway as the Chief Executive Officer of the CLO and as a Special Deputy	
4	Commissioner and gave him the power to act as his Deputy Liquidator of the Merced estate.	
5	The court amending the Liquidation Order to name Joseph Holloway as the Deputy	
6	Liquidator is necessary and appropriate here. As explained, the Commissioner is in the process of	
7	completing a pending sales transaction with Homen for the purchase of Merced's real property	
8	assets. Replacing Mr. Wilson with Mr. Holloway in the Liquidation Order will eliminate any	
9	potential challenge to Mr. Holloway's authority to sign the papers to complete the transaction on	
10	behalf of the Merced estate. Also, should any question arise regarding Homen's ability to obtain a	
11	policy of title insurance due to the recorded Liquidation Order showing Mr. Wilson as the Deputy	
12	Liquidator, amending the order to state Mr. Holloway is the Deputy Liquidator should resolve	
13	that question. The order is therefore necessary to prevent waste of the real property assets and	
14	interference with the Commissioner's sale of the property and liquidation of the Merced estate	
15	should either of these potential issues arise.	
16	CONCLUSION	
17	The Commissioner respectfully requests that the court grants his motion for an order	
18	amending the Liquidation Order to appoint Joseph Holloway as Deputy Liquidator of the Merced	
19	estate.
